
Singfest!

Residential



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Attendance

As you may have seen in the press, school attendance continues to be a focus for the Department of Education. At our upcoming consultations, you will be given a copy of of your child's current attendance record. To help you review this, we are aiming for an attendance of 95% or above.

Over 95% is recognised as good attendance.
Under 90% is cause for concern.
Under 80% is classed as 'persistent absenteeism' and could result in contact from the EWO (Educational Welfare Officer).

We greatly appreciate the support from the vast majority of families in promoting good attendance. We absolutely understand that there have been lots of bugs and sickness this winter and, if children are unwell, they need to rest and recuperate. We are hopeful that the worst is over and attendance will rise over the warmer months and we would be most grateful if parents could support in us in achieving this.

Term Time Holidays

We are unable to authorise term time holidays. We have to refer any holidays equal to or above five days (ten sessions) to the local authority. We do not receive the money raised by fines nor do we decide if a family should be fined. We understand that for many, the increased costs means making a choice between a term-time holiday or not having a holiday at all, and we appreciate that these events provide memories and support well-being. We therefore ask that parents consider when booking, if they can reduce the number of days to an absolute minimum. We also ask that parents consider their child's overall attendance and, if they know they are booking a holiday, make every effort to build a strong attendance figure beforehand.

Impact of Attendance

Our curriculum is all carefully planned to be sequential and builds on prior knowledge. If a child misses a week of school, they miss key elements of learning. This might be missing a unit of fractions that won't be revisited for another year or missing the planning and drafting stage of their writing project. Without additional staff, it is difficult to help the children to catch up. Children also comment that they feel anxious when returning to school and they miss their friends. We will do everything we can to limit the impact but it is tricky with our current budget.


Ofsted

Attendance also forms part of Ofsted's judgement on Personal Development. We believe we have an incredibly strong programme to support children's personal development, including trips, residentials, clubs, music lessons, special events and visitors. We would love to achieve 'outstanding' in this area during our inspection but we will need to raise attendance to 95%.


