Happy New Year and we hope you and your family have enjoyed a wonderful Christmas. It has been lovely hearing the children's Christmas news as they shared their postcards with the class.

Learning in Literacy, Numeracy and Science:

Literacy- Traditional tales from the UK and from around the world. Writing narratives from personal perspectives, poetry and writing explanations eg of diary farming.

Numeracy- Number and place value, adding and subtracting TUs and HTUs, multiplication 2x 5x 10x 3x, division and fractions (half, quarters, thirds). Geometry-naming and properties of 3D shapes, directions and 90 degree turns. Statistics- handling data. Problem solving.

Science- Electricity, safety using electricity, electrical sources and making simple circuits. Living things and their habitats. Variation of life. Working scientifically in our investigations.

Other educational experiences:

- •On Thursday 8th/Friday 9th January Key Stage One and Foundation are hosting a 'Borrowers' day to draw together learning from our pre Christmas theatre trip.
- This half term we hope to visit a local dairy farm to learn more about the value and importance of local farming.
- ullet Global awareness week is the week beginning 9th February and Year 2 will focus on how British fashion has changed over time and compare these styles to some of the African tribal attire.
- Finally, after half term we have our residential visit to Beeston (Weds 25th/Thursday 26th February) where we shall learn how to construct shelters, build fires and use maps. They will also create willow sculptures that will be brought back to school and displayed in the classroom.

<u>Homework:</u> Literacy homework will continue to be sent home on a Monday (returned by Wednesday) and Numeracy sent on Wednesday (returned by Friday). Reading should take place on a daily basis at school and at home and spellings are distributed and tested on a fortnightly basis.

Spotlight Author: Our Spotlight Author this term is Quentin Blake

<u>PE:</u> PE continues on a Wednesday afternoon. Children will need a full outdoor PE kit and trainers for netball and rugby. They will need an indoor kit, including black pumps for indoor dance and team building activities. Children should not wear jewellery on this day.
