Coronavirus

As parents are aware, we have a number of cases in school presently. We have liaised with Cheshire East and Public Health and we are reporting cases daily. Current guidance is that schools remain open unless they do not have enough staff to operate safely. Currently cases are:

Please complete daily LFT testing for seven days from the last reported case. We really do appreciate parents support with testing. Please also remember that staff are only following guidance and they will send children home if they become unwell. We understand that this can be frustrating but please be respectful towards staff.

Self Isolation Period Reduced:

From Monday 17 January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after **5 full days** if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.


Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests **or** anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Household Cases:

Cheshire East have reviewed their guidance and pupils are no longer required to self-isolate for five days if there is a positive case in the household. Instead, they should now follow the government guidance which is:

- take an LFD test every day for 7 days, or until 10 days after the household member who has COVID-19 started their self-isolation period if this is earlier
- take this daily LFD test before you leave your home for the first time that day
- report your LFD test results after taking each test –
 reporting positive LFD test results means that NHS
 Test and Trace can get in touch with your contacts
 and advise them on what to do; reporting negative
 LFD test results helps us understand more about
 the spread of COVID-19
- If you take an LFD test and the result is positive, you should immediately self-isolate to prevent you from passing the infection on to other people and follow the advice for people who have COVID-19. You do not need to take a follow-up PCR test.




Chicken Pox
