

What is a haiku?

A haiku is a wonderful short poem written in a specific structure:

Line one: five syllables Line two: seven syllables Line three: five syllables

What is the theme?

Prayer or praying

How do I start?

Think about using similes - what is prayer like?

Think about using metaphor—what else could you say that praying is?

The last line is the one that really needs to make people think. Look again at Kit Wright's poem above; his last line is just WOW!

This looks really easy but you will quickly find that it takes time to craft a good haiku.

Enjoy writing these amazing poems. We cannot wait to read them.


The World Outside My Window


A lot of us have spent a great deal of time at home recently. So for this competition, we want you to get creative and share what you can see outside your window.
