KS2, KS3 and KS4 students will produce an A5 leaflet entry. This can be hand-made (drawn, painted or cut out) or a computer-drawn or photographed or scanned leaflet. Hand-drawn or KS2 students will produce an A5 leaflet containing no more than 100 words. The deadline is June 30 2020 and entries should be sent to YOG20@RGS.org.
