

Weekly Bulletin



Holiday Request

Please be aware, we cannot authorise holidays during term time. Despite being an academy, Cheshire East are still responsible for monitoring attendance and they ensure that we follow the correct procedures and report all periods of unauthorised absences of five days or more (ten sessions). Cheshire East then decide whether to administer a fixed penalty fine. This does not come to the school but to the local authority. Click on the image to find out more.

Income Related Free School Meals

If your child is in receipt of income related free school meals, they are automatically eligible for the <u>Household Support Fund</u>. Last year, eligible families received supermarket vouchers, utility vouchers and access to free holiday clubs.

You can claim free school meals for each child who attends school in Cheshire East if you receive one of these benefits:

- Universal Credit with no earned income or with net monthly earnings less than £616.67
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)


We suggest you do make a claim for free school meals even if your child is in Reception or Key Stage 1 as the school can claim additional funding (pupil premium). This can be used to cover the cost of your child's trips and residentials.



What are grants for?


The charity will give to individuals in need or hardship. In the past this has included white goods and furniture.

We are able to support families with school related costs such as school uniforms and school trips.

We welcome applications from those with disabilities and, in the past, we have provided equipment to aid movement and communication.

We can fund training in order to gain employment in some circumstances. Please note, we won't give grants to eradicate debt but can signpost to organisations that can help. In the past we have made grants to debt support charities to help their work.

We also work closely with local foodbanks and, as well as helping to fund their work, have also given supermarket vouchers to foodbank clients during the Christmas season.
